Size does matter! A trawler with an 8' 6" beam or less can be trailered through all 50 states without needing an oversize permit. Your location and access to different lakes and waterways is a big part of the equation. Just be aware of the traffic and road conditions you will be trailering in so as to be safe and secure as you go.

There may be launching and parking fees as well. It's good to check out those in your area you will be using most often.

Available storage both for the summer and winter must be considered. Do you currently own a storage facility to fit the boat & trailer of your choice or would you have to rent space? To some, working on your boat in the driveway is a fun thing, not to mention showing it off to the neighbors. This has to be compared to paying a marina for seasonal docking fees and winter storage.



Towing a sizeable boat can be more than your present jalopy is up to so you may have to invest in a larger vehicle. This alone plus the extra fuel burned during towing has to be considered. There is always some difference in the price of fuel at the filling station compared to the marina prices. But remember, you will also be able to fill the boat's fuel tanks at the filling station, too. Also, the trailer will need to be licensed.

As with many choices in life, there are pros and cons to launching from a trailer or having a boat waiting for you at the dock. Coming to your dock with a boat all ready to go can be very nice and convenient. A quick trip from the office or home and throwing off the lines for a nice day or evening cruise can be relaxing and just what the doctor ordered. Extra clothes, beer in the fridge, and a nice snack or meal are all right there for your enjoyment.
